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Executive Summary

District Strategic Plan 2025

Orange County Public Schools is the eighth-largest school district in the United States and the fourth largest in Florida. The district serves more than 206,000 students at 202 schools and is one of the largest employers in Central Florida with more than 25,000 team members.

Vision: To ensure every student has a promising and successful future.

Mission: With the support of families and the community, we create enriching and diverse pathways to lead our students to success.

School Collection Development Plan

Eagle Creek ES serves 834 students enrolled in grades Kindergarten through fifth. The student population's ethnicity is made of 54% Hispanic and 46% Non-Hispanic students. Additionally, we serve a diverse population made up of 74% White, 8% Black, 0% Native, 14% Asian, 0% Pacific, and 4% Multicultural students.

The administration includes Principal Patty Cells and Assistant Principal Michael Byrne. Eagle Creek ES is proud to offer the many special programs which provide students with opportunities. These include STEPs program for gifted students, fine arts program that includes Panther Chorus and Orff Ensemble, Green School committee and recycling club. Our school also has a Battle of the Books team. We also run a Safety Patrol program with our Fifth graders. Along with a News Crew program that records the daily news for the school.

A thorough analysis of the current media center collection at Eagle Creek ES indicates that the average age of the collection is 2013 and the number of books per student is 9. The <u>American</u> <u>Association for School Libraries</u> has established a criteria for highly effective media centers that includes a ratio of 15-20 books available per student in the collection.

At this time, Eagle Creek ES does not meet the recommended standards for the number of books per student.

The analysis of the collection also revealed the following areas of strengths and concerns:

- Students in *this school* improved on the Science state achievement test.
- The average publication date of 2013 is acceptable but needs to be improved.
- There are 2,000+ eBooks, audiobooks & digital magazines available in Sora.
- This collection is in need of newer History and Geography books, and Technology books that meet the needs of our student interests.
- Many of our students read in their native language as well as emerging second language readers. This is a need in our collection.
- Weeding will focus on the OCPS Catalog Project as well as aged titles in fiction and/or nonfiction.

Comparison between 2021-22 and 2022-23 Testing Data

(adapted from https://www.fldoe.org/accountability/assessments/k-12-student-assessment/results/2023.stml) In 2023, the state transitioned from Florida Standards Assessments (FSA) to Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) for English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics. The 2022-23 for FAST and Benchmarks for Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) End-of-Course (EOC) assessments are based on **provisional** achievement level cuts that are linked to each assessment's respective 2021-22 reporting scale. Comparisons should not be made between the 2023 data and previous years' data. The implementation of FAST K-2 in the 2022-23 school year was the first administration of statewide assessments for students in grades K-2. These assessments include Star Early Literacy Proficiency, Star Reading Proficiency, and Star Math Proficiency.



- In addition to the physical media center collection, the district provides almost 2,437 eBooks, audiobooks and digital magazines.
- The Easy collection is the oldest however, these books don't become outdated and need to be weeded as often because these books circulate.
- The History and Geography section is more than five years old. Due to student interest this section could benefit from some updated titles.
- While the average age of the Technology section is 2015 our collection could benefit from some updated titles in order to meet student interest.
